giving sticks in the back of your mind.

Just as important as giving this season, is who you give to. Of course we think of our friends and family but if you take the time to think of those less fortunate you'll realize how important it really is to give this holiday season. Yet with these hard economic times, I wonder whether people will be as generous towards charity this season. According to Paypal's 2008 Holiday Survey (conducted by Ipsos) 73% of online shoppers intend to give to charity this season, as opposed to 60% in 2007 and 71% intend to give the same amount plus 10% plan to give more this year.

Every year the Mount Carmel Alumni Foundation makes charitable contributions to Carmelite orders and Central Los Angeles Area Catholic elementary schools. These schools would not be able to exist without contributions like those from the MCAF. But we need more \$\$\$! This year the Mount Carmel Alumni Foundation instituted its AJHD program in support of 10 D-16 schools' quest towards the Los Angeles Area Academic Junior High School Decathlon. Each school needs at least \$3,200 for sponsorship to cover the cost of books and supplies, the entry fee, an ad in the AJHD event program, stipends for coaches costs associated with this extracurricular program. The AJHD program is completely separate from the annual gift giving program. To continue to support these schools we need the help of our Alumni and friends. These Central Los Angeles schools stay open only by the help of sponsorships and donations like those that the Mount Carmel Alumni Foundation provide. With out your help these school would have no hope in participating in programs such as the AJHD. Theo Mount Carmel Alumni Foundation is committed to seek funding for the Deanery 16 schools that are planning to participate in the AJHD. Sponsorship of a school in the MCAF AJHD program will go directly to aiding in the educational development of these Catholic elementary school students.

In particular, schools in the inner-city like St. Raphael, where budgets are tight during the best of times, feel the strain of reduced funding. "This is a hard time for us all," reports St. Raphael School Principal Barbara Curtis. "We are all suffering. During these times, we have to focus on the children. Watching them learn gives me great joy. I want to share the gift of our mission with everyone that I know."

In particular, Ms. Curtis says that the children are thriving as they prepare for this year's Academic Decathlon. "It is an exciting opportunity," she says. "The children gain so much thanks to the Mt. Carmel Alumni Association's support of the event." Additional much needed support comes through the St. Raphael School Development Board, which is responsible for advising the school's administration and helping raise funding for scholarships and programs.

"We are particularly blessed that many of our board members have a history of Catholic school involvement," says Ms. Curtis. "In fact, some of our founding members and several of our current members [Al Alessandra, Don McCammack, Kevin McKesson, and Kevin Pickett] are Mt. Carmel High School graduates. During the entire month of January, St. John regularly hosts several Loyola H.S. seniors for their senior project. These students are the primary coaches for the academic decathlon, using a Jeopardy game format, among other strategies. Loyola students do everything from acting as classroom aides and tutors, to assisting with coaching and P.E., to special projects in the computer lab and elsewhere.

In the February 2008 Deanery 16 Decathlon, our school won the Logic competition and took 3rd place overall. Students are looking forward to sharpening their skills for the upcoming 2009 competition.

President in Poughkeepsie

Dennis Murray must have always liked the sound of the word... *President*. He was Carmel's Student body *President* as well as Long Beach State University's Student Body *President*. He may have had thoughts of being... *The President* in his younger years. Perhaps that would explain him running for congress twice before he was thirty. He was the Director of University Relations and Executive Assistant to the *President* at Long Beach State and Vice *President* of Development at Whittier College. Yes, the same Whittier College whose most famous alumnus was once our nation's *President*. This was a young man destined to be *president* of something...and at a very early age.

Dr. Dennis J. Murray...a Crusader's Son...became the youngest college *president* in America... when he was appointed *President* and Professor of Public Policy at Marist College in Poughkeepsie New York in 1979. He was only 32 years old.

Dennis was always focused and a hard working student at Mt. Carmel. He was a fierce competitor on the grid iron as well. I did not like practicing against him. He never took a play off. Dennis was a regular junkyard dog. I followed his career through mutual friends over the years. I even followed the Marist line scores in the sports page during football and basketball season.

Prior to 2005, I had not talked to him since a Carmel reunion nearly 20 years before, since then I have seen him twice on television, he was a fantastic speaker. After that I decided to try and reconnect and tell him how proud I was of him. I had recently joined the 21st Century and signed up for this cool new service called the internet. I found pictures of Dennis with the Pope....Dennis with the Dali Lama...and you guessed it...Dennis with the *President*. I thought...how perfect.

I e-mailed...Dear Dennis...if you were not so busy wasting all of your time with those guys...you could call your friends. He called me the next day.

He was still the same Dennis I knew at Carmel. We reminisced and laughed a lot. He was pleased to hear about the MCAF. When I casually mentioned Verbum Dei managing to be the last to hold on against all odds...he cut me off and said, "Send me some kids...I'll hook them up!" I told him about their financial situations. He said not to worry, he had programs. That was all that was said about it. I knew he meant it.

Today, there are 13 Presidential Scholars from Verbum Dei, St. Mary's Academy and Loyola High School studying at Marist College. Our first ambassador is a senior this year. His name is Marcus Scroggins. He is a third generation resident of the Nickerson Gardens Housing Projects. He had heard about Verbum Dei's Corporate Work-Study Program and walked over to take a look after his sophomore year at Jordan High. He was tired of dealing with campus politics (Bloods & Crips). He told Fr. John Weling that he could not afford to pay tuition but assured Father that he was a good worker and asked if he could transfer to 'The Verb'.

Marcus is the oldest of three children from three different fathers. His father is in prison. His mother is now on life-support after suffering a massive cerebral hemorrhage in October 2007 at the age of 37. She had stopped taking her medication two years prior because she felt she was too young to be sick...and the pills cost too much.

Fr. John told Marcus that he would be ineligible for sports for a year because he was not moving. He said that he did not care; he wanted to improve his grades and increase his chances of getting a scholarship. He worked for the Bank of California, tutored children from 112 st school, and wrote for the school newspaper. He cooked dinner every night for his younger brother and sister while his mother worked the swing-shift.

His senior year he made all-league in football and basketball, he had a 3.85 GPA and graduated #5 in his class. To-day he has a 3.1 GPA majoring in Business and is waiting to hear if he has been accepted into the Naval OCS program after graduation.

Nearly 30 years ago...Dennis and Marilyn first stepped foot on the Marist campus... a school they had only recently learned was founded by an order of French priests and brothers called the Marianist...in honor of our Blessed Mother. They were carrying their first born...they don't know exactly why...but they had named her Marian... They were walking down the main street on campus called...Marian Way.

I wonder if Dennis was thinking of how many students' lives he would help change forever.

I wonder if the President in Poughkeepsie recalls...or... repeats the Carmelite mantra we prayed daily so many years ago...

Remember O most gracious Virgin Mary...that never was it known...that anyone who fled to thy protection... implored thy help...or sought thy intercession...was left unaided...

I am sorry to inform you that my brother Merlin Michael Witte (class of 1943) passed away on October 1, 2008. He was so typical of so many Mt. Carmel Graduates in that he marries a graduate of a Catholic Girls High school, Donna Hurth, raised a loving family (9 children), and had a very successful career.

Merlin Michael Witte "Mike"

Born in Los Angeles, Ca March 28, 1926 Mr. Witte died at St. John's Health Center in Santa Monica on Wednesday October 1 at the age of 82.

After serving in the U.S. Air Force in WWII, he graduated from Loyola University in 1949 with a Bachelors degree in Business Administration, with a major in Accounting. He spent 3 years with the IRS before joining the Robert P. McCulloch organization as Tax and Investment Manager, which led to his founding of McCulloch Oil Corporation in 1955. Starting from zero, Mr. Witte built McCulloch Oil into one of the country's largest independent oil companies. While managing McCulloch Oil, Mr. Witte was instrumental in founding and organizing a dozen additional companies, including: McCulloch-Hancock Oil and Gas Inc; Ladd Petroleum, Inc.; Liberty North America, Inc. and Liberty Oil; Plains Exploration; Hershey Oil Co.; Offshore Exploration Oil Company and MCO Resources, Inc.

Mike was elected to the Board of Directors of several public companies and served as an officer and director of many other organizations including the Independent Petroleum Association of America, the IOGPA of CA and the western Oil and Gas Associations well as the Board of Regent at Loyola Marymount University, he has been listed in the Who's Who in America

Mike was a family man and a regular member of his church. He was also an accomplished amateur golfer, participating in and winning many tournaments, including the Bob Hope–Desert Classic Pro-Am twice. He was a proud member of the Bel-Air Country Club and served as its president.

Merlin Michael Witte is survived by his wife of 60 year Donna P. Witte and his children James, Daniel, Michael, Robert, Anne, William, his 21 grandchildren, and his brother Norman. He is joined in death by his son Joseph and daughters Catherine and Janet.
